On behalf of my client, Citizens Association for Sound Energy (CASE), and pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. 552, as amended, I request copies of any and all agency records and information, including but not limited to notes, letters memoranda, drafts, minutes, diaries, logs, calendars, tapes, transcripts, summaries, interview reports, procedures, instructions, allegation summary sheets, interim and/or final reports, status reports, computer disks, and any and all other records relevant to and/or generated in connection with:

The Inspection performed by CORDELL WILLIAMS at the Comanche Peak Steam Electric Station (CPSES), and encompassing the period from 2-7-90 through 3-2-90, and concerning his ASME Section III Compliance Review and especially WELD 12A, part of the transition piece in Book 4.

The information and records subject to this request will be used to inform and educate the public and concerned citizens about the agency's activities in general, and specifically, regarding the Comanche Peak Steam Electric Station and the NRC's Region IV office.

This request includes all agency records as defined in 10 C.F.R. 9.3a (b) and the NRC Manual, Appendix 0211, Parts 1.A.2 and A.3 (approved October 8, 1980) whether they currently exist in the NRC official "working" investigative or other files, or at any other location, including private residences.

If any records, as defined in 10 C.F.R. 9.3a (b), and the NRC Manual, supra., and covered by this request have been destroyed, and/or removed, after this request, please provide all


surrounding records, including but not limited to a list of all records which have been or are destroyed and/or removed, a description of the actions(s) taken relevant to, generated in connection implementing the action(s).

We are requesting this information as part of CASE'S ongoing monitoring project of the NRC's efforts to protect public health and safety at and near Comanche Peak. We request that fees be waived, because "finding the information can be considered as primarily benefitting the general public" 5 U.S.C. 552 (a) (4) (a). CASE is non-profit, non-partisan public interest organization concerned with assuring that the truth is made public about the safety of the Comanche Peak Steam Electric Station.

For any documents or portions that you deny due to a specific FOIA exemption, please provide an index itemizing and describing the documents or portions of documents withheld. The index should provide a detailed justification of your grounds for claiming each exemption, explaining why each exemption is relevant to the document or portion of the document withheld. This index is required under Vaughn v Rosen (I), 484 F2d 820 (D.C. Cir. 1973), cert. denied, 415 U.S. 977 (1974).

We anticipate a complete or partial response to this request within ten working days, as required by the FOIA.
