Regarding two (2) other matters, we look forward to receiving your response to my letter to you dated May 3, 1990. Based on our May 9, 1990 telephone conversation, I understand that you are preparing a response and that we should receive it in the near future. Because of Dr. Sarma's health, we agreed that there was no need for you to reply immediately. Secondly, we understand that you will advise us whether it is necessary to notify the referring physician of the affected patient and the patient or a responsible relat've of the patient, pursuant to 10 CRF 35.33, when a misadminist. Cion is determined to have had no adverse medical effect on the patient. In other words, if a technical misadministration is found to have occurred but if that technical misadministration had no adverse effect on the patient,

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does the Licensee remain obligated, pursuant to 10 CFR 35.33, to notify the referring physician of the affected patient and the patient or a responsible relative of the patient.
