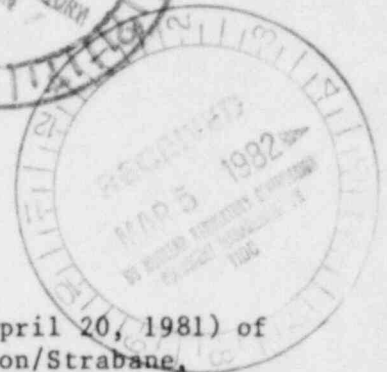
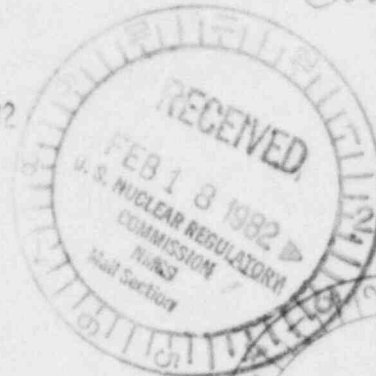

The data from the fifth quarter (January 30, 1981, through April 20, 1981) of the current radon monitoring program in the Canonsburg/Houston/Strabane, Pennsylvania, area have been forwarded to the individual program participants.

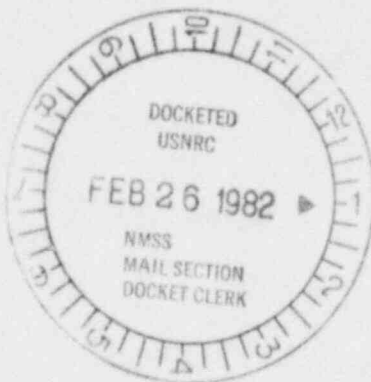
During this period, the radon concentrations at the various locations under study ranged from 0.05 picocuries per liter to 1.0 picocuries per liter; a group of control locations averaged 0.14 picocuries per liter with a range of 0.08 to 0.19 picocuries per liter.
