As required by Item I.A.1.1 of NUREG-0660 and NUREG-0737, NRR was to conduct a post-implementation review of STA training programs. Our review, based on the information furnished in your response to NUREG-0737 and your letter dated March 9, 1982, is now complete.

We based our review on a determination of whether your response met the intent of guidelines given in the NRC's September 13, 1979 and October 30, 1979 letters. These letters provided guidance concerning the technical education and training qualifications for STAs. The October 30th letter specified that the STA shall have a bachelor's degree or equivalent in a scientific or engineering discipline. The September 13th letter specified three functional areas: General Technical Education, Reactor Operations Training, and Transient and Accident Response Training.

Our review indicated that your STA training program is acceptable in meeting the intent of the guidelines set forth in the above referenced letters.
