As a resident of Putnam County, not more than 12 miles from the Indian Point Nuclear facility, I am deeply concerned about the decommissioning being done safely, not only for myself and my wife but for all the children who may be facing early death or a long process of deteriorating health.

Holtec and its recent partner both have criminal records and should not be allowed to do business in New York State. They have no experience in decommissioning nuclear sites and claim that they will find other companies to assist them. We want experienced companies to do that work, not criminal entities.

Holtec manufactures the casks they want to use for high level radioactive waste storage. Those casks have thin walls and are inferior to the much thicker walled casks used abroad. They are not safe based on the reports of experts. Quick and cheap is how they have done business. There is no reason to think it will be any different at Indian Point. They will set up a corporate structure for Indian Point allowing them to escape any financial liability if there is a calamity from their efforts. It is a typical "take the money and run" proposal.

Decommissioning Indian Point is not business as usual. It is the long term health and safety of the entire Hudson River Valley and the lives of 20 million people who live and work in the 50 mile radius surrounding the reactors that is most important.
