5. Participation of Applicants

PL and AE will participate in the operation of Susquehanna SES, Units 1 and 2, under the following arrangements:

The Applicants own Units 1 and 2 as tenants in common, with PL owning an undivided ninety percent (90%) interest and AE owning an undivided ten percent (10%) interest therein.

PL will have absolute authority and discretion for the management, operation and maintenance of Susquehanna SES, and is authorized to act on AE's behalf in such capacities, including the pursuit of required authorizations, permits and licenses from the Nuclear Regulatory Commission.

In almost all circumstances AE will pay 10% of all operating costs of Susquehanna SES and will receive 10% of the capacity and energy of Susquehanna SES.

AE will pay for the operation and maintenance of, and will own a 100% interest in 42.3 miles of the Sunbury-Susquehanna No. 2 500 KV transmission line erected on right of way parcels 7 through 188, inclusive, and a one-third undivided interest in the right of way applicable to these parcels. PL will operate and maintain this line for the account of AE. PL will have the complete and free use of this line so long as either unit of Susquehanna SES is in commercial operation. PL shall provide to AE a transmission service for AE's power produced by Susquehanna SES from Susquehanna SES to PL's points of interconnection with other utilities with which AE has arrangements for the delivery of such power for AE.

5. Class and Period of Licenses Applied for and Use to Thich Facilities Fill Be Put

The Licenses hereby applied for are Class 103 Operating Licenses as defined by 10 CFR 50.22. They are requested for a period of forty (40) years from the date of issuance of the operating licenses.

The Applicants also apply for such additional source, byproduct and special nuclear material licenses as may be necessary or appropriate to the possession, use and operation of the licensed facilities.

The facilities will be used as a part of PL's and all of AE's electric utility plant for the generation of electric power. The facilities will consist of two complete nuclear power plants each producing approximately 1050 MWE net of electrical power. Each unit will consist of a nuclear steam
