## AMENDMENT TO PETITION FOR LEAVE TO INTERVENE OF THE TOWN OF SOUTH HAMPTON

NOW COMES the Petitioner, TOWN OF SOUTH HAMPTON, by and thrits attorneys, SANDERS AND McDERMOTT PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATION of Hampton, County of Rockingham and State of New Hampshire, and by way of Amendment to its Petition for Leave to Intervene submits the following contention pursuant to 10 C.F.R. 2.714 (b):

- 1. The transmission lines emanating from the Seabrook Nuclear Power Plant would, as presently routed, have a most severe and adverse impact upon Indian Ground Hill, a ridge of high ground which is historically significant as an Indian camp ground and possible burial ground.
- 2. The transmission lines emanating from the Seabrook Nuclear Power Plant would, as presently routed, have a most severe and adverse impact upon the historic district at the center of the Town of South Hampton.
- 3. The transmission lines emanating from the Seabrook Nuclear Power Plant would, as presently routed, have a most severe and adverse impact upon the historic areas known as Jewelltown and Highland.
- 4. The transmission lines emanating from the Seabrook Nuclear Power Plant would, as presently routed, have a most severe and adverse impact upon property values within the Town of South

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Hampton commercial and residential districts.

5. Reasonable alternatives to the present transmission line routes including, but not limited to, underground placement of lines, must be formulated prior to any grant of operating authority.
