Dear Mr. Secretary:

I wish to express my support for the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's proposed rule on nuclear power plant license renewal (10 CFR Parts 2, 50 and 54, RIN 3150-AD04). This is an important program to ensure adequate, reliable and affordable electricity for America.

The current forty year license term for nuclear power plants is not based on safety or environmental concerns. The Act specifically provides for license renewals and at a time when utilities are having difficulty siting and constructing any type of new generating facility, retiring safe, reliable nuclear power plants simply because a license expires does not make sense.
