License, Inc., P-401RECORDED CIVIL ANSWERS TO NRC INTERROGATORIES

Pursuant to 10 CFR 2.250(b)(1), the Counsel for the Intervenor in the above-captioned proceeding, hereby submits the following supplemental answers to questions 1 through 9, interrogatories under date of September 25, 1979.

1. Same as information provided by affidees.
2. Intervenor CFC has no knowledge of the specific materials and techniques that should be used by Battelle Seattle to effectively component in the SFR. However, Intervenor does submit that given the failed fuel problem and the length of the proposed storage time, techniques for monitoring the pool and solutions for possible problems should be discussed.
3. The "other components" Intervenors referred to in question 1(7) are as follows:
  - a) filter rod
  - b) stack
  - c) control rods
  - d) baffle plates
  - e) control rods
4. Intervenor CFC will have no objection to this as it contend that none the devices in other components (See 17)

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Applicant's plans call for a significant increase in water level as well as in fuel stored. The projected length of storage is well beyond that of any storage time experience thus far with stainless steel type fuel. It seems reasonable, therefore, that any number of problems may arise with time. There may be problems with the gate and/or the gate seal as a consequence of the increased water levels, resulting from corrosion and pressure. There may also be long-term and possible undetected corrosion problems with the tracks, control rods and boron plates. CREC's contention 1(f) is as relevant as it was when written. A recent notice of delay in the release of the ST and SIS and related NRC Staff to DPC questions seems only to support the validity of contention 1(f).

10. Pursuant to 10 CFR 2.732 Intervenor CREC feels that any further analysis of DPC plans related to "other components" can only be completed satisfactorily after DPC completed their analysis. Any communication from NRC Staff as to the relevance of ongoing interrogatories to DPC in this matter would be helpful.
