## NOTICE OF ISSUANCE OF AMENDMENT TO FACILITY OPERATING LICENSE

The U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has issued Amendment No. <sup>75</sup> to Facility Operating License No. DPR-39, issued to the Commonwealth Edison Company (the licensee), which revised Technical Specifications for operation of Zion Station, 'Unit 1 (the facility) located in Zion, Illinois. The amendment was effective on June 26, 1982.

The amendment provides a one-time change to the Technical Specifications to allow one safety injection pump to be inoperable while the power level will not exceed 5% of rated power level. The amendment was authorized on an expedited basis to maintain the plant at steady-state condition and avoid a shutdown transient shown by our evaluation to be unnecessary but required by the Technical Specifications unless amended.

The request for the amendment complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulations. The Commission has made appropriate findings as required by the Act and the Commission's rules and regulations in 10 CFR Chapter I, which are set forth in this license amendment. Prior public notice of this amendment was not required since this amendment does not involve a significant hazards consideration.

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The Commission has determined that the issuance of this amendment will not result in any significant environmental impact and that pursuant to 10 CFR §51.5(d)(4) an environmental impact statement or negative declaration and environmental impact appraisal need not be prepared in connection with issuance of this amendment.
