Subject: UNINTENTIONAL EXPOSURE OF INFANT'S THYROID

On October 25, 1993, a Region V inspector discovered during a routine radiation safety inspection at the Queen's Medical Center in Honolulu, Hawaii, that a 9 month old nursing infant had received 25 rads to its thyroid as a result of an iodine 131 administration to its mother on December 2, 1991.

The mother was administered 15 microcuries of iodine 131 for a diagnostic scan. Although the patient noted on a hospital form that she was breastfeeding, the technologist failed to notice the notation on the form until the patient returned for a scan the following day. The patient was informed of the oversight by the licensee and was instructed to stop breastfeeding. The authorized user and the referring physician were also notified an December 3, 1991.

The infant's absorbed dose was calculated from information obtained during an uptake scan of the mother 6 hours after the administration.

No press release has been made.

Region V has contacted a medical consultant who will determine whether the incident has medical significance. Information relevant to this event is still being gathered by the inspector.
