Dear Commissioner Ahearn:

I am writing you as a stockholder of General Public Utilities Corporation with the request that TMI-1 be restarted as quickly as possible. I do not understand why the Commission has not already authorized that the plant be restarted, as the plant had been in operation several years with no serious malfunction when the TMI-2 accident occurred. I understand that all additional safety requirements have been completed and that other nuclear plants in this country in the same category have been allowed to restart.

It does not seem fair to me that G.P.U. should be discriminated against with the result that the G.P.U. stock I own is practically worthless and I am receiving no dividends on my hard-earned savings. I think we G.P.U. stockholders have been punished long enough!
