It has been twenty months since the ascident at Three Mile Island 11. At the time TMI I was in operation, presumably efficiently and safely.

Surely by now, the closed No. I Plant has been inspected and brought to the necessary safety standards required by your Commission.

I suspect the fear of opposing the attitudes of the anti-Nuclear public, which I presume prevails in the proximity of Harrisburg, is a reason for not allowing the restart.

It must be shown that Nuclear Power has demonstrated to be the safest and as yet the most economical source of electricity, TMI I soon.
