SUBJECT: NOTICE OF VIOLATION (NRC REGION I INSPECTION REPORT NO. 50-333/93-24)

This refers to the results of the routine resident safety inspection conducted by Messrs. W. Cook and J. Tappert from October 10, 1993 to November 20, 1993 at the James A. FitzPatrick Nuclear Power Plant, Scriba, New York. A summary of the inspection findings was presented to you and members of your staff at the conclusion of the inspection.

This inspection was directed toward areas important to public health and safety. Areas examined during the inspection are described in the NRC Region I inspection report, which is enclosed with this letter. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of observation of activities, interviews with personnel, and document reviews.

Performance by the FitzPatrick staff during this inspection period was mixed. As you and your staff identified early in the maintenance outage, an increase in human performance related problems had occurred and you took action on November 5 to conduct a safety stand-down to reemphasize to your staff the need for greater attention to detail and self verification. We acknowledge these efforts, but view them as not entirely effective. Subsequent to the November 5 safety stand-down, a number of additional events involving improper personnel performance and procedural noncompliance occurred. Individually, these events had minimal safety consequences, but in the aggregate indicated a broader performance problem which is contrary to regulatory requirements and, as such, is being cited. We are particularly interested in what additional actions you have taken or plan to take to address this potential adverse personnel performance trend.

You are required to respond to this letter and should follow the instructions specified in the enclosed Notice of Violation (Notice) when preparing your response. In your response, you should document the specific actions taken and any additional actions you plan to prevent recurrence. After reviewing your response to this Notice, including your proposed

correction actions and the results of future inspections, the NRC will determine whether further NRC enforcement action is necessary to ensure compliance with NRC regulatory requirements.

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The responses directed by this letter and the enclosed Notice are not subject to the clearance procedures of the Office of Management and Budget as required by the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1980, Pub. L. No. 96.511.
