This letter is in regard to a petition filed by the National Emergency Management Association concerning a recommended rule change in 10 CFR Part 50, Appendix E, Section IV.F.1.

The present requirement for an annual full scale exercise for each nuclear power plant places an excessive burden on local governments and their citizens. It is especially burdensome because Grundy County, Illinois is one of the few counties in the nation located within the EPZ of two or more generating stations (Dresden, LaSalle, and Braidwood).

The burden is twofold. First, the dollar cost for time spent preparing for and participating in annual exercises is excessive. In the case of Grundy County the exercises are redundant and therefore require unnecessary expenditures of local funds. Such practices are commonly referred to as "wasting taxpayers money." Secondly, these annual exercises require the unpaid volunteer sector of our emergency response teams to take time off from their regular employment in order to participate. In Grundy County we have 8 volunteer fire departments, 5 volunteer emergency squad/ambulance companies, 75 Emergency Service & Disaster Agency volunteers, plus numerous Red Cross volunteers. The typical volunteer loses \$90 to \$150 per day in pay when they are absent from work to participate in these required annual exercises. This is ridiculous!

With regard to the petition filed by the National Emergency Management Association concerning frequency of exercises, we recommend that offsite local agencies be required to participate as follows:

- Only once every 3 years with PARTIAL participation, regardless of the number of EPZ's impacting the area.
- b. Only once every 7 years with FULL participation, regardless of the number of EPZ's impacting the area.
