Thank you for informing me that your office has "abandoned" the Detroit Institute of Arts application for renewal of its materials license (a fact that I was not previously informed of) - and also especially thank you for attempting to have your colleagues reverse their decision. As I stated during our telephone conversation yesterday, my request for the renewal fee (\$540) has been in process in the City of Detroit system for several months now and I am told that they are very close to sending a check to the NRC. However, if our present application is abandoned, I will have to start all over again - a prospect that I do not look forward to - and that will cause further substantial delay.

I am enclosing copies of two letters concerning the correct fees owed by the DIA for custom device registration for your files as you requested. Since to date I have not had a response to my April 6, 1993 letter from Ms. Glenda Jackson, I will be pursuing this matter with her in the near future.
