I'm writing urging the license authorization at the earliest possible date for the construction and operation of the CLAIBORNE ENRICHMENT CENTER in Claiborne Parish, Louisiana.

My husband and I are retired living 1.2 miles from the proposed site. Bear Creek which runs through our 200 acre farm heads up near the proposed property site, and of course we have been concerned about clean, pure water. Our public water system well is approximately 8/10 of a mile from the site.

As you know most of us who read the Environmental Impact Statement actually comprehend very little of it; however I'm convinced that CEC will be doing everything possible to operate the plant so that it will be environmentally mafe both for the workers and the surrounding community. I have toured Duke Power Plant and talked with the people about property taxes and their fears and there were none.

Certainly we realize the need for the plant as it relates to job opportunities and tax benefits for the parish. We realized that property values would escalate and were concerned that people on fixed incomes would have a problem with that; however I was told by neighbors of Duke Power Plant that because of the broad tax base of the plant the parish property taxes would possibly decrease.

Having lived through the days of coal oil lamps, water drawn from a well, outdoor privies, no television, no microwaves, etc., etc. etc. I am convinced the American people would rebel against going back to life without electricity. Although I've read recently that people are saying children living and playing near high voltage lines are developing cancer.
