LICENSE RENEWAL RULEMAKING

The license renewal Commission paper includes the statement that the proposed rulemaking package could be forwarded to the Commission within 4 months after the Commission directs the staff to proceed with rulemaking. I believe that this is ach evable; it is a difficult and ambitious task. This will be a substantial rulemaking, not a minor rule change. Establishing and ensuring consistency throughout all the documents associated with this rulemaking, and ensuring that the documents are consistent with the maintenance rule documents, will be a large effort. A significant amount of work will be necessary to develop a new Statement of Consideration (SOC) and to resolve issues from the current SOC. Additionally, a significant effort will be required to prepare a new regulatory analysis since the staff's proposed approach has not been covered in the current regulatory analysis. Other issues, which are stated in the Commission paper, that will require considerable effort include: (1) defining the term "passive" as it applies to ITLR SSCs and ITLR functions, (2) clarifying ITLR screening requirements for support systems determined to affect Technical Specification operability determinations for ITLR systems, and (3) clarifying licensee evaluations requirements for passive long-lived structures and components. The schedule for producing the proposed and final rulemaking package is given in Enclosure 1.

To meet the schedule, NRR intends to take the lead for this rulemaking and will devote priority attention to completion of this rulemaking. RES and OGC priority attention will also be needed. To ensure that this effort gets priority attention, I intend to establish a dedicated team to work full time on this effort to complete all elements of the rulemaking package. Enclosure 2 identifies the eight members of the staff assigned to this working group; note the participation of OGC and RES on this team. I will be working through the Deputy Executive Director for Nuclear Reactor Regulation, Regional Operations and Research (DEDR) to have these or other RES and OGC staff. assigned to the License Renewal Project Directorate in NRR to provide the focused effort needed to accomplish the activities associated with the rulemaking and meet the schedule. Additionally, the staff will have to coordinate closely with ACRS since the normal lead time for ACRS review will have to be reduced.
