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Subject: NRC Region I Resident Inspection Report Nos. 50-317/93-33 and 50-318/93-33 (November 14, 1993 - December 25, 1993)

This report transmits the findings of the safety inspection conducted by the resident inspectors at the Calvert Cliffs Nuclear Power Plant. At the conclusion of the inspection, these findings were discussed with Mr. Cruse of your staff.

Areas examined during this inspection are described in the NRC Region I Inspection Report that is enclosed with this letter and were selected in order to ensure that your fac. "v is operated with due regard for the public health and safety. Within these areas, the Espection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observations by the inspectors. Overall, the NRC has concluded that your facility was operated in a safe manner.

During a verification of the fuel assemblies loaded into a dry storage canister. BG&E determined that the assemblies in one row of the storage rack were not in the positions specified by the loading procedure. While there were no actual safety consequences, the failure to follow the loading procedure was a violation of NRC requirements. The violation was not cited because the criteria for discretion specified in Section VII.B. of the NRC Enforcement Policy were satisfied.

In another instance, BG&E failed to rigorously implement foreign material exclusion (FME) controls in the spent fuel pool area. The failure to implement FME controls was a violation of NRC requirements, as specified in the enclosed Notice of Violation (Appendix A). While there were no actual safety consequences, the failure to follow FME control procedures was a recurring problem. You are required to respond to this letter and should follow the instructions specified in the enclosed Notice of Violation when preparing your response. In your response, you should document the specific actions taken and include any additional actions you plan to prevent recurrence.
