REPROGRAMMING CHANGES

REACTORS

These program changes primarily reflect a slight increase to salary and benefit allocations, a reduction of 2 FTE to the Reactor Safety Research program, and a small shift in training and travel funds from reactor programs to nuclear material programs.

NUCLEAR MATERIAL

This program increase primarily reflects a slight increase to salary and benefit allocations, a staff increase to help improve NRC's regulation of medical licensees, and additional training and travel funds.

MANAGEMENT AND SUPPORT

This program decrease reflects the discontinued funding of a "cost free" expert to IAEA due to the creation of a nuclear safety attache position at the U.S. Mission in Vienna and several other minor funding adjustments.

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
