

2. What is being done with the waste water at TMI? Sources, which only Mrs. Parsons can quote, are saying that the water is going into the Susquehanna and the NRC is not monitoring the dumping. "The entire lower Susquehanna and the Chesapeake will be contaminated."
3. Why have there been no public notifications of venting? There must be ventings as the decontaminators are on a regular schedule of entries into the damaged reactor?
