Background

SFC is authorized by its license to revise its RCP provided that the revision does not reduce the effectiveness of the Plan. By application dated September 24, 1992, SFC submitted changes to its Plan.

Discussion

The changes to the Plan involve the location of portable monitoring equipment and emergency equipment. Equipment is now located in the Emergency Response Equipment Room and the North Guard House instead of the Health Physics Lab and the UF, Plant. The range for an instrument was also changed. These modifications do not reduce the response effectiveness of the Plan.

SFC has revised the license to add the date of this revision and to include an organizational change that has already been approved.

Conclusion/Recommendation

The staff agrees with SFC's conclusion that the revisions do not reduce the effectiveness of the RCP. The proposed amendment is for the convenience of the Commission in maintaining current references to the RCP.

The Region IV Principal Inspector has no objection to this proposed action.


Dear Mr. Graves:
