Subject: Possible Rupture of Americium-241 Well Logging Sealed Sources

At 10:05 a.m. on September 1, 1982, Region I received telephone notification that licensee representatives suspect that one or both of two americium-241 sealed sources (250 millicuries each), lost down a well during logging operations, may have been ruptured during recovery operations. The sources were lost on August 19, 1982. On August 27, 1982, while overdrilling the well hole, licensee representatives measured radiation levels of approximately 1 milliroentgen per hour with a Victoreen 493 survey meter with an end window geigermuller tube. On September 1, 1982, radiation levels of approximately 1.5 milliroentgens hour were observed in the sludge removed from the well hole. The licensee has ceased all operations and is holding all subcontractor equipment onsite. The Pennsylvania State Department of Environmental Resources' Pittsburgh office has dispatched an inspector to the site. He is scheduled to arrive at approximately 12:30 p.m. Region I will dispatch an inspector on September 2, 1982. Neither Region I nor the licensee plan to issue a press release pending further onsite evaluations.
