I approve the Environmental Protection Agency's request to use the Center for Nuclear Waste Regulatory Analyses (CNWRA) to support its high level waste activities for the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant subject to the following. First, areas of work that clearly will involve a conflict of interest should not be included. Second, areas of work that are better characterized as being in the gray area, should be carried out under contingencies that eliminate future conflicts of interest by essentially constructing a Chinese wall, e.g. the work should be performed by subcontractors or additional staff brought on to do this work. Third, if there is work in the interest of both agencies, that will clearly not present a conflict of interest, then applicable contingencies would be those expressed in items 2 and 3 on page 8 of the paper. Contingency number 4 (the agreement defining procedures to be followed in resolving potential interagency conflicts arising from use of Center staff) on page 8 should be developed in such a way as to apply to all of the above. All of these constraints may well render it unlikely that any benefits (such as those outlined in the paper) will accrue to the NRC. However, I give my approval simply in the spirit of interagency cooperation.
