Dear Members of the Appeal Board:

The purpose of this letter is to confirm in writing my oral representation to the Appeal Board that the stipulation by and between the Applicants/Licensees and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is acceptable to the NRC Staff because it assures that sufficient quantities and types of dosimetry will be available to emergency workers responding to a radiological emergency at the Susquehanna facility. Thus, in the Staff's view there is no longer a controversy among the three parties to the Commonwealth's appeal on the dosimetry issue.
