Dear Mr. Lodge:

This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) appeal of the decision to withhold the March 22, 1982 memorandum from Regional Administrator John Collins to Mr. Richard DeYoung, Director, Office of Inspection and Enforcement, transmitting Region IV's final draft inspection and investigation reports relating to Hayward Tyler Pump Company. NRC's Executive Director of Operations addressed the remainder of your appeal in a July 14, 1982 letter. The Commission has determined that the final draft reports are exempt from mandatory public release and that the public interest is best served by maintaining those reports in confidence at this time. Accordingly, your appeal is denied.

The draft reports constitute the final input of the Regional Office to an ongoing investigation. The reports do not represent a final agency position on this matter. Primary responsibility for concluding the investigation and recommending a course of action has been shifted to the NRC's new Office of Investigations. The Region's final draft reports contain a small amount of information which has not been previously disclosed. Release of this material could interfere with the conclusion of the investigation and is therefore exempt from mandatory release under Exemption 7(a) of the FOIA and the Commission's regulations. 10 CFR 9.5(a)(7) (i). Furthermore, release of pre-decisional draft documents of this nature could lead to public confusion regarding the ultimate basis for Commission decisions and is therefore protected under the deliberative process privilege of Exemption 5 of the FOIA and the Commission's regulations. 10 CFR 9.5(a)(5). Any segregable non-exempt portions of these documents have already been made available through release of prior drafts of these reports and related documents. Finally, policy directives have been issued which now forbid release of draft inspection and investigation reports, primarily for the reasons cited above. Accordingly, pursuant to 10 CFR 9.15(a), the Commission has determined that the Region's final draft reports should continue to be withheld in their entirety.

This is in further response to your letter dated April 8, 1982, in which you requested, pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, copies' of documents concerning the Hayward Tyler Pump Company.

In my letter to you dated May 6, 1982, I stated that ten documents were still being reviewed. That review has now been completed and enclosed are the first nine documents listed on the appendix to this letter. The tenth document contains investigatory records compiled for law enforcement purposes and is being withheld from public disclosure pursuant to exemption (7)(A) of the Freedom of Information Act (5 U.S.C. 552(b)(7)(A))and 10 CFR 9.5(a)(7)(i) of the Commission's regulations, because disclosure of the information would interfere with an enforcement proceeding.

Pursuant to 10 CFR 9.15 of the Commission's regulations, it has been determined that the information withheld is exempt from production or disclosure and that its production or disclosure is contrary to the public interest. The person responsible for this denial is Mr. Samuel J. Chilk, Secretary of the Commission.

Dear Mr. Lodge:

This is in partial response to your letter dated April 8, 1982, in which you requested, pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, copies of the draft inspection and investigation reports with their transmittal letters, correspondence, complaints submitted to NRC, and the identity of all persons present at a February 12, 1982 meeting regarding the Hayward Tyler Pump Company; copies of all documents referring to Marcus Rowden since June 1977; and copies of I&E Reports 81-12 and 81-20 for Comanche Peak.

The documents listed on the Appendix to this letter are enclosed with the exceptions noted below.

A home telephone number has been deleted from document 35 pursuant to exemptions (6) and (7)(C) of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) and 10 CFR 9.5(a)(6) and (7)(iii) of the Commission's regulations because disclosure of this information would constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. The remaining portions of this document are enclosed. Document 37 consists of investigatory records compiled for law enforcement purposes, and is being withheld from public disclosure pursuant to exemptions (7)(A) and (D) of the FOIA and 10 CFR 9.5(a)(7)(i) and (iv) because disclosure of the information would interfere with an enforcement proceeding and disclose confidential information furnished by a confidential source.

The review of documents 12, 14, 15, 21, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33 and 36 has not been completed. As soon as our review is completed, we will advise you of our disclosure determination.

Pursuant to 10 CFR 9.9 of the Commission's regulations, it has been c termined that the information withheld is exempt from production or disclosure, and that its production or disclosure is contrary to the public interest. The person responsible for the denial of document 35 is the undersigned. The persons responsible for the denial of document 37 are the undersigned and Mr. Richard C. DeYoung, Director, Office of Inspection and Enforcement.

This denial may be appealed to the Commission's Executive Director for Operations within 30 days from the receipt of this letter. As provided in 10 CFR 9.11, any such appeal must be in writing, addressed to the Executive Director for Operations, U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Washington, DC 20555, and should clearly state on the envelope and in the letter that it is an "Appeal from an Initial FOIA Decision."

At this time the I&E investigation is still continuing, and I expect it will be at least another month or two before it is completed and a final report issued.

With respect to that portion of your request for documents referring to Mr. Rowden, as you were informed in a telephone conversation on April 15, 1982 with Carol Ann Reed, of my staff, it is reasonable to assume that the files located throughout the various Offices and Divisions of the NRC contain documents relating to this subject. We cannot, however, short of examining every file possessed by NRC, state with any degree of confidence that all documents relating to it have been located. In view of the scope and nature of this portion of your request, we conclude that it was not meet the requirements of 5 U.S.C. 552(a)(3). Accordingly, no further action will be taken with respect to this portion of your request.

If you consider this to be a denial, you may appeal this determination within 30 days to the Executive Director for Operations.
