Dear Mr. Engelken:

The PGE letter dated September 26, 1979 forwarded to you the response to IE Bulletin 79-19 "Packaging of Low-Level Radioactive Waste for Transportation and Burial". That letter described the training provided to Plant personnel in DOT and NRC regulatory requirements, waste burial license requirements and Plant procedures pertaining to packaging and shipment of radioactive material.

A subsequent reorganization in the Plant Radiation Protection Section necessitates a change in the training which will be performed. Specifically, the following training will be provided:

Staff positions responsible for developing and maintaining the procedures used for radioactive material shipment and disposal will receive annual reviews of the applicable sections of 10 CFR 20, 10 CFR 30, 10 CFR 71, 49 CFR, U.S. Ecology burial site license, and applicable Plant procedures. In addition, these personnel will review changes to the above documents that affect Plant procedures.

Chemistry and Radiation Protection Technicians and Utility Workers who monitor or package radioactive materials for shipment will receive initial training in applicable Plant procedures as well as periodic reviews of changes to these Plant procedures.

These changes in the training program should ensure that personnel directly responsible for packaging and shipment of radioactive material will receive the necessary training.
