

AFFIDAVIT OF STEPHEN N. SALOMON


1. I, Stephen N. Salomon, being duly sworn, state as follows: I am State Programs Technical Analyst in the State Relations Section, Office of State Programs. I have been employed by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission or its predecessor agency since 1973. My responsibilities relate to the development and implementation of NRC policy and programs in the area of cooperation and coordination with state governments, interstate organizations and other federal agencies in the licensing and regulation of nuclear power facilities and materials. In this capacity, I am familiar with the status of the proposed Southeast Interstate Low-Level Radioactive Waste Management Compact.
2. I am informed and believe that the states involved in the formation of the Southeast Interstate Low-Level Radioactive Waste Management Compact (except North Carolina) have passed legislation enacting different versions of a compact. The differences in these versions have recently been resolved in meetings among appropriate state representatives. A uniform compact bill embodying the

resolution of these differences is now being drafted. Creation of the compact will require approval of appropriate legislation by the states and by Congress.

3. Among the differences resolved in these meetings is the schedule for the closing of the Barnwell facility and the opening of a new disposal site. The states have agreed that the Barnwell facility, which will serve as the compact's first disposal facility, will be closed on December 31, 1992 and that a second disposal site will have been selected, licensed and opened by December 31, 1991.

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
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
