SUBJECT: NOTICE OF VIOLATION

(NRC INSPECTION REPORT NOS. 50-325/90-29 AND 50-324/90-29)

This refers to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) inspection conducted by Richard L. Prevatte on August 1 - September 7, 1990. The inspection included a review activities authorized for your Brunswick facility. At the conclusion of the spection, the findings were discussed with those members of your staff identif and in the enclosed inspection report.

Areas examined during the inspection are identified in the report. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observation of activities in progress.

The inspection findings indicate that certain activities appeared to violate NRC requirements. One violation (325,324/90-29-05), references to pertinent requirements, and elements to be included in your response are described in the enclosed Notice of Violation. In addition to the need for corrective action regarding the specific matters identified in the enclosed Notice, we are concerned about the implementation of your work control program that permitted this situation, as well as others, to develop. Consequently, your response should describe those particular actions taken or planned to improve the effectiveness of your program. In addition, four other apparent violations are described in the enclosed inspection report which are under consideration for escalated enforcement action. Accordingly, no Notice of Violation is being issued at this time, and no response to these particular violations is required. However, please be advised that the number and characterization of apparent violations described in the enclosed inspection report may change as a result of further NRC review. An Enforcement Conference to discuss these issues has been scheduled for October 16, 1990. You will be advised by separate correspondence of the results of our deliberations on this matter.

In accordance with Section 2.790(a), a copy of this letter and its enclosures will be placed in the NRC Public Document Room.
