Subject: SUMMARY OF THE SOUTHEASTERN MASSACHUSETTS HEALTH STUDY

On October 9, 1990 at 4:00 p.m., the Massachusetts Department of Public health (DPH) released a summary of its cancer study, after some of the studies findings were leaked to the media. The full study will be issued later this week.

The principal conclusions, as stated from the summary are as follows:

- The findings of this study show that the risk of leukemia for cases diagnosed between 1978-1983 was higher for those with the greatest potential for exposure (i.e., those who lived and/or worked the closest for the longest period of time) to the Pilgrim nuclear power plant. The risk of leukemia was almost four times higher for those individuals compared to those with the lowest potential for exposure.
- Although a cause and effect relationship cannot be proven, a possible explanation for this finding is that the elevated risk of leukemia may be associated with the higher plant emissions that occurred in the mid-1970's.

The DPH plans to implement continuous monitoring of radionuclide emissions, and develop a State air quality standard more stringent then that of federal agencies and other States, and to continue surveillance of cancer in the Plymouth area.

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
