

Dear Senator Lugar,

On June 27 the Nuclear Regulatory Commission announced its "Below Regulatory Concern" (BRC) policy, which will allow radioactive waste to go to local landfills, incinerators and sewers. DOE weapons plants can now be declared BRC and never cleaned. Radioactive material and by-products will be allowed into consumer and industrial goods.

This BRC policy is a terrible mistake. It is totally opposed to the efforts being made all across this land to reduce toxic materials from harming our environment.

As you know, Indiana already has its own environmental problems and in addition, we are the dumping ground for other states. Now is the time to speak out against this BRC policy. We trust you will use your good office to voice our concern.
