The following item-by-item response addresses the inspection findings referenced in the Notice of Violation dated 9/20/93.

Please dis egard our previous correspondence.

Item No. 1: St. Joseph's Hospital receives radiopharmaceutical unit doses from a central radiopharmacy. We were unaware that the information attached to the syringe was incomplete. The clinical procedure to be performed or the patient's name will be incorporated into the label attached to the syringe. The nuclear medicine technologist has been given orientation as to this new procedure; therefore, there should be no reoccurrence.

Compliance was achieved on 9/21/93.

Item No. 2: Our nuclear medicine technologist was unaware that hanging her handbag with cosmetics inside was a violation of license conditions. This item was reviewed for clarification and no reoccurrence is anticipated. The handbag was removed the day of the inspection.
