Hi Wren,

I was talking to the lead technical reviewer about the level of non-proprietary detail for the inspection report. His thinking is that the findings and conclusions should be public. He understands that you'd probably want to keep the method and acceptance criteria proprietary. The key is that at least to some level, he thinks the findings should be there to support the conclusion.

I've seen some different approaches to reporting the inspections. Here are some examples... 72-27 provides a fairly detailed overview of their inspection ([ML18215A202](#)). 72-17 provides more of a high-level summary, but they also refer to previous inspection reports that are public ([ML17086A039](#)). Some of the CoCs I've seen are also variable (details, cite public presentations, etc).
