NOTICE OF ISSUANCE OF AMENDMENT TO FACILITY
OPERATING LICENSE
AND NEGATIVE DECLARATION

The U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has, pursuant to the Initial Decision of its Atomic Safety and Licensing Board dated October 5, 1978, issued Amendment No. 34 to Facility Operating License No. NPF-1, issued to Portland General Electric Company, the City of Eugene, Oregon, and Pacific Power and Light Company, which revised the license and appended Technical Specifications for operation of the Trojan Nuclear Plant (the facility), located in Columbia County, Oregon. The amendment is effective as of its date of issuance.

The amendment permits modifications of the spent fuel storage pool which will increase the storage capacity from 280 fuel elements to a capacity of 651 fuel elements.

The Initial Decision is subject to review by an Atomic Safety and Licensing Appeal Board prior to its becoming final. Any decision or action taken by an Atomic Safety and Licensing Appeal Board in connection with the Initial Decision may be reviewed by the Commission.

The application for the amendment complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulations. The Commission has made appropriate findings as required by the Act and the Commission's rules and regulations in 10 CFR Chapter I, which are set forth in the license amendment. Notice of Proposed Issuance of the Amendment was published in the Federal Register on February 14, 1977 (42 F.R. 9068). A hearing was requested by David B. McCoy; the State of Oregon, acting by and through its Department of Energy and its Energy Facility Siting Council; Susan M. Garrett, acting on her own behalf and as the representative of the Coalition for Safe Power; and Sharon S. McKeel. The hearing was held January 4-20, January 30-February 10, and April 17-26, 1978, and subsequently the above-referenced Initial Decision was issued on October 5, 1978.

The Commission has prepared an Environmental Impact Appraisal dated November 11, 1977, and has concluded that an environmental impact statement for this particular action is not warranted because the actions authorized by this license amendment will not significantly affect the quality of the human environment.
