This letter forwards the report of the announced inspection of your radioactive waste management and shipping program conducted by Mr. L. Eckert of this office on January 3 through January 7, 1993 at Seabrook Station, Seabrook, New Hampshire. The inspection was continued in the Region I office through February 10, 1994 to review the most current status of your 10 CFR 50.59 review concerning the storage of polyethylene liners in the Waste Processing Building. Preliminary inspection findings were discussed by Mr. Eckert with members of your staff on January 7, 1994 at the conclusion of the onsite portion of the inspection. No additional findings were identified during the in-office portion of our inspection, which was concluded on February 10, 1994.

Areas reviewed during the inspection are important to health and safety and are discussed in the enclosed inspection report. These areas included quality assurance audits and surveillances, training and qualifications of personnel, the radwaste organization, the radiological controls organization, implementation of the radwaste program, radioactive material shipping records, interim radwaste storage, scaling factors, and contamination control.

The inspector noted that the radwaste training and radwaste management programs were well implemented and that radwaste volume generation remained small. No radiological safety concerns or violations of regulatory requirements were identified.

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No response to this letter is required. Your cooperation with us is appreciated.
