Thank you for your letter of January 6, 1994, which responded to the comments and recommendations from our 1993 review of the Kansas radiation control program.

We appreciate the positive actions that you and your staff are implementing with regard to our comments. Your responses constitute acceptable refinements of the program. In particular, we were pleased to learn that the six regulatory requirements that had not been adopted within the 3-year period allowed by the NRC, i.e., (1) quarterly audit of the performance of radiographers, (2) bankruptcy notification, (3) misadministration reporting requirements, (4) well logging requirements, (5) NVLAP certification of dosimetry processors, and (6) decommissioning requirements, became effective Kansas regulations on September 20, 1993.

We recognize the effort that must be expended by a State to maintain updated regulations for compatibility purposes. Thank you for the support and cooperation you and your staff have extended to our representatives.
