

Dear Mr. Hopkins:

At our meeting at Savannah River Operations Office on September 11, 1956, regarding the close out of the subject contract, and particularly the disposition of Government owned equipment in our possession under said contract, one important item discussed was decontamination.

You will recall it was confirmed that Horizons would undertake, at the Government's expense, to decontaminate all such equipment (as well as all of its own property and premises) contaminated as a result of the contract work, prior to making any disposition of Government property. I do not remember, however, if the Commission indicated whether or not it would inspect the results of our efforts in order to determine if the equipment could be disposed of in the agreed upon manner, particularly since some of the equipment may be transferred to the general public.

I would appreciate it very much if you could let me know the Government's thoughts in this regard, particularly as we anticipate we will be ready to dispose of some Government owned equipment in the not too distant future.
