

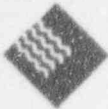

Dear Marian:

As we discussed yesterday, my March 7, 1994 request for documents definitely includes all transcripts of statements taken by OI. As OI has repeatedly stated, the purpose of its investigation is to determine if OSC intentionally violated any federal regulations, i.e., training, safety, etc. Clearly, the transcripts of the 40 or so former and current employees all contain questions regarding training and safety, etc. and are therefore highly relevant to, inter alia, OSC's ability to put together its affirmative defenses, and are therefore all relevant to the suspension order litigation.

Finally, so we are clear, please do not assume that just because I have sent out supplemental discovery requests that I am satisfied with the Staff's responses to prior served discovery. Thank you.
