2. Conference Summary

The issues identified in Inspection Report No. 030-06309/93-002 were discussed. It was determined that RMC Calibration Services, Incorporated (RMC) was not a licensee from March 31, 1993, when it came into possession of the byproduct material until December 20, 1993, when License No. 07-30114-01 was issued. Possession of byproduct material without a valid license is an apparent violation of 10 CFR 30.3. Even though the apparent violations identified during the inspection are not being cited, the company's corrective and preventive actions were reviewed.

Members of the NRC staff then reviewed with the licensee's representative the NRC's enforcement policy and the options the policy provided. The licensee's representative was then advised that they would be notified of the NRC's staff decision. The meeting was then adjourned.
