IMPACT OF PROPOSED LICENSE FEE SCHEDULE REVISIONS

ON DATA COLLECTION SYSTEM

In your memorandum of July 17, 1981, you expressed the need for 18 to be able to identify inspection manhours expended for specific inspection reports. I asked my staff to look into the impact on our MPS system to do this. Inspectors currently record their MPS time by docket, but not by report number. Adding the requirement to record by report number will place a sizeable burden on our inspectors, not to mention changes to the MPS system, forms, etc. I would like to avoid that, if possible.

I appreciate the need to be able to respond to a licensee's question about the work for which he is being billed. However, I think we can do this without expanding MPS system coding requirements. If a licensee questions his bill, we could then give you a list of all inspection reports issued during the billing period for each docket in question. While the licensee would not be able to trace manhours to specific reports, he could clearly see the inspection work (reports) for which he was billed. This seems to be the primary objective we are trying to achieve.

Please let me know if you find this alternative a suitable substitute.
