According to the staff, the Assistant United States Attorney in the Office of the United States Attorney for the Western District of Pennsylvania who is considering a criminal referral regarding matters relating to the January 20, 1993 suspension order that is the subject of this proceeding has determined that the release of these documents (as well as a number of others) would no longer harm the ongoing investigation relating to the referral. By separate issuance today, we are granting the staff's motion. 9403300070 940318 0502 ADOCK 03031765

In accordance with our February 1, 1994 order, counsel for the staff should contact OSC counsel and make arrangements to provide the nineteen documents as promptly as possible. In addition, on or before Tuesday, March 29, 1994, the staff and OSC should file a joint report on the status of discovery. The report should be served upon each of the Board's members so as to ensure its receipt by close of business on that date.

So that we can assess the impact on discovery of the staff's disclosure of the nineteen documents, the parties' report should detail which particular outstanding objections to pending discovery requests and which specific portions of any pending motion to compel or motion for a protective order still entail matters in controversy between the parties. This would include the staff's objections filed on January 14 and February 18, 1994; OSC's objections filed on March 4, 1994; and the staff's March 14, 1994 motion to compel and motion for protective order.

The report also should present the parties' positions regarding the continuing validity of the protective order

granted to OSC in the Board's February 1, 1994 prehearing conference order.

It is so ORDERED."
