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## ORDER

On March 24, 1994, the NRC staff filed a petition for review and/or motion for directed certification of the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board's order, LBP-94-06. The staff had earlier filed a motion for stay of the Board's directives in LBP-94-06, which is under active con⊾ eration by the Commission. T. Commission entered a "housekeeping" stay on March 17 to preserve the <u>status</u> <u>quo ante</u> while the staff's motion could be considered.

Under the usual circumstances, the Commission's rules provide the other parties 10 days to answer in support of or opposition to the staff's March 24 petition and, if the petition is granted, the rules normally contemplate a further opportunity to address the issues accepted for review. See 10 C.F.R. §§ 2.786((b)(3) & (d). However, strict adherence to that sequence of filings in these circumstances would not serve the parties' interests, because it would delay the Commission's resolution of these issues. Moreover, the parties' arguments regarding the merits of the staff's position on the issues for which review is sought have been substantially addressed by the answers to that staff's stay motion.
