NRC STAFF'S STATUS REPORT ON SUBPOENA ENFORCEMENT

On March 9, 1994, Oncology Services Corporation (OSC) and representatives of the government held a conference with the United States District Court for the Middle District of Pennsylvania to discuss the enforcement of the NRC administrative subpoenas. The Court decided that it would review the material at issue from which OSC had redacted information and determine whether OSC's redaction was reasonable. In addition, as to other documents sought by the NRC, the parties agreed to meet at OSC's offices in an attempt to agree on the transfer of the information. A copy of the conference transcript is attached hereto as attachment 1.

1 THE COURT: We met with counsel in
2 regard to the request of the Plaintiff, the
3 Petitioner, to enforce certain subpoenas through
4 which the Petitioner is seeking information which
5 it claims is reasonably related to its
6 investigation of the Defendant or Respondent.

7 At the conference the Court was
8 informed that there were three general areas in
9 dispute. That those areas relate to weekly
10 activity reports and notes and minutes and that
11 notes and minutes of administrative and medical
12 meetings; is that what you said?

13 MS. SHARRIN: Regional administrator
14 meetings and medical director meetings.

15 THE COURT: The Respondent generally
16 argues that they made these available, but they
17 redacted information which was not felt to be
18 reasonably related.

19 The Petitioner argues that much of
20 the information in these documents might well be
21 reasonably related.

22 The parties being unable to resolve
23 that, the Court will review these materials to
24 determine whether the redaction was reasonable or
25 not.

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The second area involved the payroll information wherein the Petitioner appears to be seeking the names and addresses and other information about all of the employees of the Defendant and those entities which the Defendant either owns or manages.

There is somewhat of an argument by the Respondent that they may not have the ability or the right to make some of these names and other information known.

The Respondent also argues that some of the employees may not be in a position to either know of or have information that is pertinent or reasonably related to this investigation.

The Petitioner argues that it needs to review the entirety of the payroll information so that judgment can be made as to which of these parties might need to be interviewed to determine whether or not they, indeed, do have information or knowledge that might lead to other information that is pertinent to the investigation.

The third area regards resumes and applications of all Defendant employees. Here again-similar-arguments are made as to the second

1 area of information.

2 After lengthy discussion of these
3 matters, at the Court's suggestion the parties
4 agree that counsel for both sides will meet at the
5 Defendant's offices on dates to be selected in
6 April of 1994.

7 The Court's suggestion is that the
8 meetings should last no more than approximately
9 six hours per day and should consume no more than
10 two days.

11 It is the Court's suggestion that
12 all of the information sought should at least be
13 available on that day, and if the parties cannot
14 agree on transfer of that information then they
15 will thereafter within seven days of the meeting
16 make a report to this Court outlining the areas
17 that remain in dispute and the Court will
18 thereafter attempt to devise a method to resolve
19 those disputes.




