Mr. Collins is the Regional Administrator, Region IV, located at Arlington, Texas. In this position he is responsible for managing and directing all NRC functions and programs assigned to the region. This includes licensing, as well as inspection and enforcement functions. Until July 1982, this also included the conduct of investigations. Since July 1982, this is the responsibility of the Office of Investigation. Functional responsibility includes issuing notices of violation, orders for modifying, suspending or revoking licenses, and other action decisions or civil penalties in accordance with the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, and the Reorganization Act of 1974. Mr. Collins was appointed to this position in November 1981. Prior to this appointment, he was the Deputy Director, Region IV, having held this position since January 1981.

Mr. Collins joined the NRC in April 1975, as Chief of the Effluent Treatment Systems Branch, in the Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation (NRR). He served at Middletown, Pennsylvania, with the NRR Task Force for Three Mile Island Support from March 30, 1979, until June 1979, when he was appointed Deputy Director of the TMI Program Office. In this capacity, he was the Senior NRC official onsite at TMI, responsible for overseeing recovery and cleanup operations following the accident at TMI.

Mr. Collins joined the former Atomic Energy Commission in 1963, as the industrial hygiene engineer for the Idaho Operations Office. In February 1971, Mr. Collins assumed the position of Material and Process Engineer in the Division of Waste Management, Germantown. In November 1971, Mr. Collins was assigned to the Regulatory Division, Division of Licensing, as a specialist in waste management and effluent monitoring control systems. In 1973, Mr. Collins was appointed Section Chief in the Effluent Treatment Systems Branch. Mr. Collins has 25 years' experience in the field of waste management, effluent and environmental monitoring, and occupational health.

Mr. Collins attended Pennsylvania State University and Idaho State University, majoring in General Engineering.
