In references 1 through 3, Houston Lighting & Power (HL&P) committed to implementing a two phase Surveillance Procedure Enhancement Program. The first phase, consisting of a pilot project of approximately 51 high priority procedures is complete. During this initial phase there were several lessons learned that are being incorporated into the second phase.

This second phase originally consisted of a significant, but limited number of the station's surveillance procedures. Subsequent to making the original commitment, it was decided to include the remaining surveillance procedures. This resulted in almost doubling the scope of the project. Because of the increased scope and lessons learned, the anticipated completion date for the second phase of the Surveillance Procedure Enhancement Program is being extended from December 31, 1996 to the end of 1998. The potential for this change in commitment was commented upon in Reference 4 during one of the recent Restart Issue inspections.
