

NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Harry S. Truman Memorial

During an NRC inspection conducted on March 9, 1994, a violation of NRC requirements was identified. In accordance with the "General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions," 10 CFR Part 2, Appendix C, the violation is listed below:

Condition 22.A. of License No. 24-15235-03 requires, in part, the licensee to conduct its program in accordance with the statements, representations, and procedures contained in the application dated February 10, 1989.

Item 7 of the referenced application dated February 10, 1989, names the individuals serving on the Radiation Safety Committee.


Contrary to the above, as of March 9, 1994, persons other than those named are serving as members of the Radiation Safety Committee and the licensee failed to obtain a license amendment authorizing the membership changes prior to implementing the changes.

This is a Severity Level IV violation (Supplement VI).

Pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 2.201, Harry S. Truman Memorial is hereby required to submit a written statement or explanation to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III, 801 Warrenville Road, Lisle, Illinois, 60532-4351, within 30 days of the date of the letter transmitting this Notice of Violation (Notice). This reply should be clearly marked as a "Reply to a Notice of Violation" and should include for each violation: (1) the reason for the violation, or, if contested, the basis for disputing the violation, (2) the corrective steps that have been taken and the results achieved, (3) the corrective steps that will be taken to avoid further violations, and (4) the date when full compliance will be achieved. If an adequate reply is not received within the time specified in this Notice, an order or a demand for information may be issued as to why the license should not be modified, suspended, or revoked, or why such other action as may be proper should not be taken. Where good cause is shown, consideration will be given to extending the response time.
