Millstone Nuclear Power Station, Unit No. 1 and No. 2
Combined Inspection Nos. 50-245/82-11 and 50-336/82-11

This letter addresses the Notice of Deviation forwarded by reference (1). The corrective action has been completed and was forwarded by reference (2).

Reference (2) also contains a description of the events which led to the failure to meet or extend a commitment date, resulting in the issuance of the subject Notice of Deviation.

As the events described in reference (2) indicate, the March 1, 1982 commitment date was inadvertently omitted when the corrective action commitment was reinstated in the commitment follow program at the station.


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This resulted in the associated MASP revision being handled as a routine administrative change scheduled to be completed by August 31, 1982. In the context of the telephone conversation of July 9, 1982, it was the failure to include the commitment date in the commitment reinstatement which was described as an "administrative oversight". Immediately upon being reminded of the commitment date during that telephone conversation, the associated MASP revision was assigned top priority and completed expeditiously.


As the failure to meet this commitment date is an exception from normal practice, and as it was the result of an error in the way the item was reinstated in the commitment follow program, no changes to that program are considered to be warranted. However, personnel using the program have been cautioned to ensure that the commitment action has been completed prior to deleting items from the follow program.
