We have received the enclosed Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) correspondence dated February 15, 1994, transmitting the findings for the offsite emergency preparedness aspects of the 1992 Fermi 2 exercise conducted on June 3, 1992.

FEMA identified no new deficiencies in the performance of offsite agencies during the exercise; however, five Areas Requiring Corrective Action (ARCAs) were identified. Appropriate objectives related to these items should be planned for your next scheduled exercise.

We fully recognize that any further corrective actions to be implemented may involve parties and political institutions which are not under your direct control. Nonetheless, we would expect the subject of offsite preparedness for the area around the Fermi 2 Nuclear Power Plant to be addressed by you as well as others.
