In July, September, and December 1993; Houston Lighting & Power Company (HL&P) submitted corrective action plans to address weaknesses identified with the Emergency Preparedness program. Since submitting this information, an in-depth self-evaluation of the South Texas Project Emergency Response Program was performed.

As a result, a comprehensive action plan and integrated schedule for 1994, as discussed with members of Region IV staff, has been developed and is being implemented. It addresses program weaknesses previously identified in References 1 and 2, and the root causes of long standing Emergency Response training issues. Key elements of this plan are:

- 1. Re-alignment of the Emergency Response Organization (ERO) to correlate emergency duties with assigned line management and station responsibilities.
- Development of indoctrination training for new ERO candidates.

This plan provides a more complete response to the concern raised in Weakness 9317-02, regarding technical assessment, diagnosis , and mitigative action in the Technical Support Center; accordingly it supersedes previous commitments made in References 1 and 3.
