Dear Mr. Fitzpatrick:

This refers to the routine safety inspection conducted by Messrs. James A. Isom, David J. Hartland, Christopher N. Orsini, and George D. Replogle of this office from January 19 through March 11, 1994. The inspection included a review of activities at your Donald C. Cook Nuclear Plant, Units 1 and 2, facility. At the conclusion of the inspection, the findings were discussed with those members of your staff identified in the enclosed report.

Areas examined during the inspection are identified in the report. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of a selective examination of procedures and representative records, observations, and interviews with personnel.

Based on the results of this inspection, certain of your activities appeared to be in violation of NRC requirements, as specified in the enclosed Notice of Violation (Notice). The violation is a concern to us because the failure to have a procedure in hand during maintenance activities resulted in a reactor trip. We are also concerned with the lack of operator control of plant evolutions during this inspection period that resulted in off-scale reactor coolant system level indication, loss of volume control tank level, and inadvertent closure of the residual heat removal pump suction valve.

Additionally, during this inspection, other activities appeared to be in violation of NRC requirements. However, the violation was a licensee identified item and, in accordance with 10 CFR Part 2, Appendix C, Section V.G.1, a Notice of Violation was not issued.

You are required to respond to this letter and should follow the instructions specified in the enclosed Notice when preparing your response. In your response, you should document the specific actions taken and any additional actions you plan to prevent recurrence. After reviewing your response to this Notice, including your proposed corrective actions and the results of future inspections, the NRC will determine whether further NRC enforcement action is necessary to ensure compliance with NRC regulatory requirements.
